Reminder: Daylight Saving Time ends on November 5, 2017. When local daylight time is about to reach Sunday, November 5, 2017 at 2:00:00 AM clocks are turned backward 1 hour to 1:00:00 AM local standard time. Sunrise and sunset will be about 1 hour earlier on Nov 5, 2017 than the day before.

Upon entering this child-safe, user-friendly learning portal, choose from English Language Arts, Mathematics, Earth Science, Life Science, Engineering and Technology activities. Each of these content areas offers a variety of games, videos, puzzles and e-stories. Time spent together exploring **eStars** allows your child to share what he/she is learning in technology class. This time together provides an opportunity for your child to practice using a mouse to guide the cursor, helping to develop hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills. **eStars** activities are designed for children up to 5 years of age. Families are invited to share this learning portal with

older siblings; the **Explorer** level targets ages 5-7 and the **TechStar** level targets ages 8-10. **FYI: eStars activities are different from those presented in your child's technology** classes. eStars is <u>not</u> compatible with mobile devices.
